## November Conferences

Quality home and school communication is so important for a child to reach his/her full potential. We pride ourselves on our approachability. As a community, we can be proud of the frequency and quality of our communications. November conferences are an integral part of the communication plan. It is important to purposefully set a time early in the school year for every teacher to talk to every parent of the children in his/her class.

I do think the way in which we schedule conferences has become outdated. We set aside a day for parents to come to school during the day to talk to the teacher; children do not attend. That worked for many years, but I don't think that approach works for the majority of today's parents. It creates child care and work place challenges. I have observed most conferences are scheduled either early in the morning or late in the afternoon. That is what works with today's family dynamic.

## November Conferences...(continued)

Here are the two approaches to conferences that I am pondering for next year:

- We do not schedule a conference day. All parents will be expected to make an appointment to speak to the teacher before or after school the second week of November.

or

- We schedule two conference days. On Monday, grades k-3 report for class and grades 4-8 schedule conferences. On Tuesday, grades k-3 schedule conferences and grades 4-8 report for class.

## After School Happenings...

Learning is fun at All Saints, even after school. The Tinkering Club began in January and continues to tinker. ## Benchmarks

You may have heard a little buzzing about the new benchmark tests. The diocese has introduced these tests to us beginning with math, a good place to begin. The test, *the same test*, is given three times a year. It measures progress. It is not used as a grade; one student is not compared to another; it helps guide instruction. The primary purpose is to measure your student's progress. The secondary purpose is to identify gaps in the curriculum and instruction.

The results help guide instruction and help identify what skills need to be reviewed, re-taught, or practiced as a group and individually. The individual results help identify your student's strengths and weaknesses. These are addressed with direct instruction, maintenance, and Compass Learning.

## Science Fair Update

The All Saints Catholic School Science Fair will be Tuesday, April 20th. This is a wonderful educational experience. It gives each middle school student a chance to explore a topic that he or she finds fascinating. It also gives every child in the school a chance to learn about the scientific process and report results in a scientific manner.

We welcomed Mrs. Rosalie Schwartz to All Saints this year as our middle school Science teacher and coordinator. Mrs. Schwartz has significant experience with Science Fairs. She has coordinated this

event for many years at various schools. We are grateful for her knowledge and dedication.

This year, students in kindergarten through grade four will present group displays and students in fifth through eighth grades will exhibit individual projects. Information was sent home after mid-term exams, explaining the new format for grades five through eight. It included all instructions needed to make this year's Science Fair a rewarding and educational experience for all of our students.

## School Uniform

The appearance of our students is of utmost importance. Dress and appearance reflect the quality of schoolwork, conduct, and performance. **Spring uniform rules will go into effect April 15th.** Please be sure to purchase appropriate uniform pants, jumper and/or uniform skort. If you make the purchase from Lands' End, you can be sure the skort/jumper is acceptable. If you choose to make the purchase elsewhere, please be attentive to the details. Skorts and jumpers should not have any adornments. Socks should cover the ankle. Remember, school shoes should be brown or black with a heel of less than one inch.

Boys' hair must not be any longer than the top of the shirt collar or the top of the eyebrows. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

*Please note: The uniform short is an option for students when the weather turns uncomfortably warm. If your student does not have the correct uniform short or if the short is ill-fitting, your student should wear the correct uniform pant or skort/jumper.*

## E-Mission—Team All Saints 2010

This year the middle school students will participate in *FSI: Fire Scene Investigation*. Imagine....

*The year is 2037 and NASA has established a lunar outpost to enable lunar and Martian exploration, mining and astronomical observations of deep space. Our astronaut crew at this lunar outpost rou-*

*tinely checks each module on the base. During a routine check to record thermal data on one of our storage units, an astronaut detects a fire in progress! Investigation Specialists calculate various components of the fire. The CO<sub>2</sub> & O<sub>2</sub> Specialists use an on-line Fire Simulator that yields data. They calculate the mean, median and mode for the data given and then graph a box and*

*whiskers plot for each run of the simulator trying to determine a central tendency for the data. Students use math skills and statistics to determine the cause of the fire and to make recommendations for fire suppression on the moon. The Communications Specialists report all information to Mission Control and update the data received from their teams using the Mission Control Board.*

This program was made possible by the ExxonMobil Grant provided through Paul Moyer Car Care and the PTO. It is through the generosity and cooperation of Mr. Paul Moyer and ASCS PTO that we were able to expand this program to include sixth grade as well as the seventh and eighth grades. Don't you wish we were able to participate in neat projects like this when we were in school?!
